Financial crisis needs sure-footed decisions, not grasping at straws

After the frenzied attempt by the Bush administration and Congress to "do anything" to abate the global financial crisis, and committing trillions of taxpayer funds and federal guarantees, without oversight and without a plan, it is time for Congress to stop funding new financial experiments. It is time for America to take stock of what we have learned and plan for the wiser use of precious federal funds and guarantees by the Obama administration.

We have identified the immediate causes of the crisis, it is a failure of government and Wall Street, via shoddy regulation of speculative mortgage lending together with congressional mandates to <u>Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac</u> to purchase these mortgages; plus the proliferation of toxic "mortgage derivatives" and spurious over-rating by rating agencies.

We also have learned that a legislative and executive ballout process dominated by presidential panic, Treasury hubris and a Congress more eager to campaign (and get pork) than govern will not get us out of this mess. A lot also has been said about creating a new Resolution Trust Corporation to solve the problem, like the RTC did in the early 1990s. Therefore, I suggest:

A Congressionally-mandated half to new spending commitments by the Bush administration so the Obama administration is not handcuffed by lack of funding or further irrational and irreversible actions;

An Investigation of actions by the United States and others to stem

the global credit crisis, to determine whether policies adopted have been effective and to establish optimal criteria for new approaches.

A bipartisan transition team to explore economic stimulus options. All options on the lable begin with the Issue of which stimulus would have the greatest effect. Six sectors demand priority consideration; housing; auto making (where it is estimated the demise of the Big 3 automakers could cost over 3 million jobs and send the country Into deeper recession); energy Independence; infrastructure to create jobs and to increase our competitiveness; incentives to maintain consumer spending and spur venture, real estate and other investment; and agriculture/minerals.

An address to the nation by president-elect <u>Barack Oberna</u> promising the end of unplanned responses to the financial crisis, and a plan based on an analysis by the best and brightest during the transition period.
